**Subject: Evaluation Results for 2019-2020 Startup in Resident (STIR) Program Challenge Statement #1 –  
*Electronic Jury Questionnaires and Related Projects.***

Upon evaluation of all proposals submitted to the STIR Challenge Statement #1, the Superior Court of California, County of San Francisco (Court) will **not** award a provisional contract for this project.

The scores for each responsive Proposer are as follows:

DeciZone, Inc.	104.67
Autocene, Inc.	66.03
Swantide	54.28
NoQueue, Inc.	27.25
Proof Data Technology	25.72

The scores reflect a combination of points awarded based on the Request for Proposal (RFP) and interview criteria for a total not to exceed 130 points.

Challenge Statement 1 intended to implement an efficient and user-friendly technology solution to replace the current paper jury questionnaires used by the Court's Jury Office. Relatedly, the Court will not award a provisional contract for its remaining STIR projects as it does not have active or responsive bids on file:

- Challenge Statement 2 – seeking a user-friendly technology solution to improve and enhance the Jury Office's communication with jurors.
- Challenge Statement 3 – seeking an automated and streamlined solution for cash handling processes and counting tasks.
- Challenge Statement 4 – seeking an efficient solution to assist the Court in identifying court user's income for the purpose of qualifying for income-based services

This Notice shall be posted at the San Francisco Superior Court Civic Center Courthouse for five business days, from March 4, 2020 through March 11, 2020. The Court reserves the right to issue similar RFPs in the future.
