## THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, and the proclamations of states of emergency by Governor Gavin Newsom and President Donald Trump, it was determined that the conditions described in section 68115(a) of the Government Code were met with regard to the Superior Court of California, County of San Francisco on three prior occasions: March 16, 2020, March 19, 2020, and April 10, 2020. At the request of Presiding Judge Garrett L. Wong, Orders issued on those dates authorizing the court to implement certain relief authorized by section 68115. Upon the renewed request of Presiding Judge Wong, it is determined that emergency conditions, as described in section 68115(a), continue to exist. Accordingly, pursuant to section 68115(a) and (b), the Superior Court of San Francisco County is authorized to do the following:

Declare that from June 2, 2020, to June 19, 2020, inclusive, be deemed holidays for purposes of computing the time for filing papers with the court under Code of Civil Procedure sections 12 and 12a, if the above-described emergency conditions substantially interfere with the public's ability to file papers in a court facility on those dates (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(4)).
